

MINUTES OF THE September 2, 2003 SQUIRE PARK COMMUNITY COUNCIL BOARD MEETING

The Squire Park Community Council Board of Directors' monthly meeting convened at Providence/Swedish Hospital at 7:00 P.M., led by Bill Zosel, President of the Board. Present were Board members John Jeannot, Tom Teicher, Rob Lee, Kris Fulsaa, Anthippy Petras and Scotia MacKay.

1. Sabey Corp—Providence 1910 Building.
 - a. Noise level may be up to 55 decibels during day, 45 at night.
 - b. SPCC requested that Sabey build a barrier to reduce the amount of noise at all times
 - c. Sabey will look into it
2. Minutes of previous meetings—approval deferred to the next meeting.
3. Election of Treasurer—Rob Lee is our new treasurer.
4. Seattle University public benefit proposal—
 - a. Trying to get money from ProParks fund for 12th Ave project
 - b. Public hearing Friday—we will be requesting more than a substantial financial contribution from SU to develop a cultural center; want their ongoing collaboration
 - c. Potential synergy with Langston Hughes?
5. Pratt Park issues
 - a. Still have \$10K from Small & Simple grant as well as \$30K from Seattle Arts
 - b. Paul Sorey receiving community feedback on several ideas for sculptures in the park
6. Michelle Jones of the Central Area Development Association—206-328-4511
 - a. Good Neighbor Committee provides matching grants for building materials to improve the exterior of commercial buildings—painting, awning, doors, windows—they are actively seeking suitable projects to which they can give grants
 - b. Need to review with city and get approval before starting project
 - c. Need to take “before” picture and “after” pictures
 - d. Present all receipts to Michele Jones—takes about 3 weeks for reimbursement after project is complete
 - e. \$10K limit per project, usually up to \$5K per building
7. Wing Luke project—
 - a. Ongoing project to address racial issues
 - b. We will provide publicity for their activities
8. King County Juvenile Court/Detention Center—
 - a. No money in current budget to maintain site; seeking future budget
 - b. We will send a letter to Councilman Gossett urging that the next budget include adequate funds to maintain the site
9. Newsletter and October membership meeting
 - a. We will shorten the window for folding and delivery of the newsletter to allow sufficient time for preparation of articles and layout
 - b. We will have information about voting, and will begin a series of quarter-page articles with images to spotlight various businesses in the community
 - c. Future idea: list of resources
 - d. Agenda for October membership will include Pratt Park and possibly Wing Luke
